ROUND GROVE SCHOOL 1892

The Round Grove School was located two miles east and one mile north of Ridgeway, Missouri. The building in the photo was the second on the site... the first was a small log cabin. The school also served as a community meeting place, voting location and at times a church. The school was closed in 1921 when the area was incorporated into the Ridgeway School District. 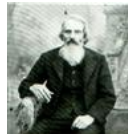
